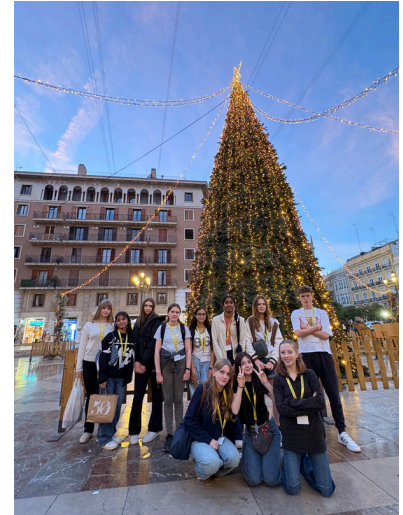

Later, we visited the Cathedral, exploring its rich history and impressive interior, deepening our understanding of Valencia's cultural heritage. We finished the day in true Valencian style by enjoying a delicious traditional paella, a well-earned reward after such a busy and enriching day. Another outstanding day filled with culture, language, learning, and fun, the students continue to impress us with their curiosity, behaviour, and growing confidence in Spanish.

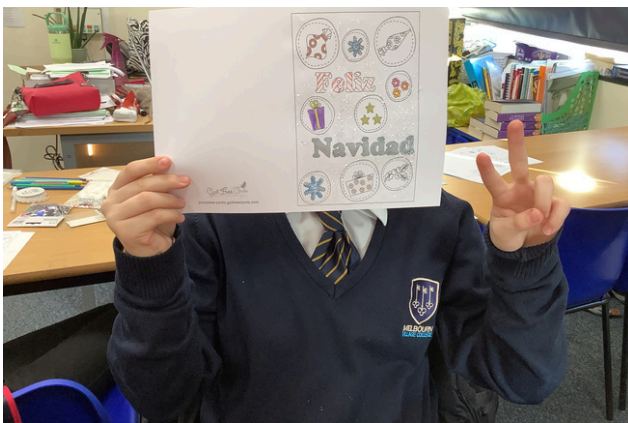
## 12 days to Christmas Count Down

Students and staff participated enthusiastically, creating a positive and inclusive atmosphere across the school.

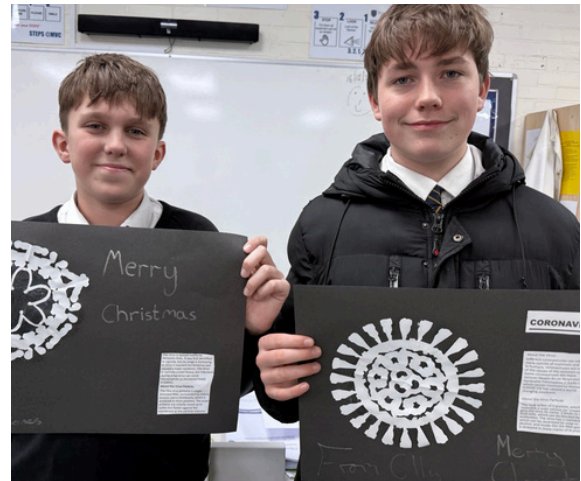


## 12 days to Christmas Count Down - Key Stage 3 Science Club

## **MVC Futures Talk with: Nico Schonken - Deputy Director of Performance and Analytics at HPFT**

MVC students were delighted to welcome Nico Schonken, Deputy Director of Performance and Analytics at Hertfordshire Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust (HPFT), who delivered an insightful talk to our students on the role of data and analytics within the NHS.

Nico shared an overview of his work at HPFT, a leading mental health and community services NHS Trust in Hertfordshire. He explained how his role involves leading specialist teams responsible for data strategy, data engineering, and advanced analytics, supporting evidence-based decision-making across the organisation.

Students gained valuable insight into how artificial intelligence and machine learning are increasingly being used within the NHS to improve performance monitoring, service planning, and patient outcomes. Nico also highlighted the growing demand for data skills in healthcare and the real-world impact that data-driven innovation can have in supporting mental health services.

The session provided an engaging and practical perspective on careers in data, analytics, and digital transformation within the public sector.

A full mock timetable will be shared with students and parents before the Christmas break, but students will be sitting a paper for all their core and options subjects and should expect to sit two subject papers on some days.

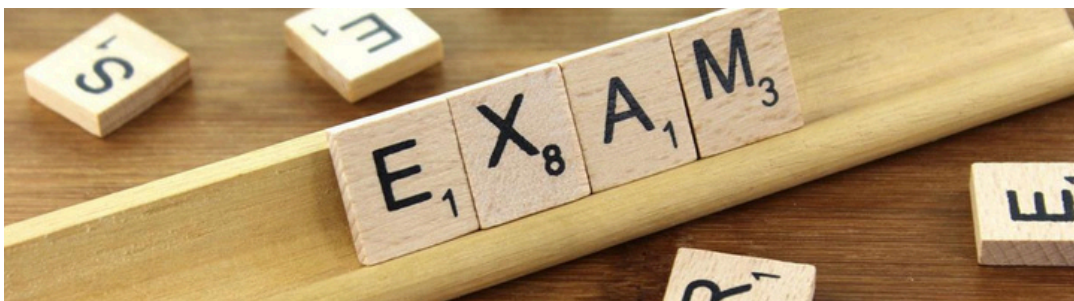

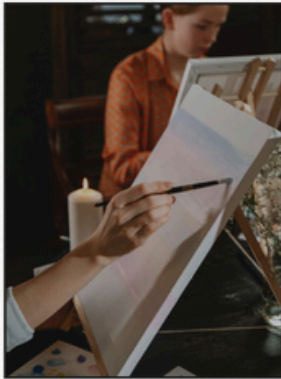
